Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay

Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay provides rehabilitation for people with acquired brain injury with a focus on social, cognitive, educational and pre-vocational rehabilitation.

Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay holds two ACC contracts:

- The **Supported Activities Service** is for **clients with moderate to severe brain injury** and is delivered from Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay and at other community-based venues -
Active ACC5783 Ongoing ACC5784
- The **Supported Living Services** provide **one-to-one support** for people in the community -
Active ACC5785 Ongoing ACC5787

Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay has a contract with the Ministry of Health to provide **Community Day Activity Programmes**.

Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay works closely with **ACC, Options Hawke's Bay, Enliven**, and other **rehabilitation services** in the community.

A **multidisciplinary** approach benefits clients.

Throughout all these programmes clients receive **one-to-one support** from staff.

Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay offers a **wide range of programmes**.

Strive Rehabilitation @ Hawke's Bay:

- Specialises in **community-based brain injury rehabilitation**
- Provides both **short term and long term** rehabilitation programmes
- Encourages **whānau/family** involvement and participation
- Demonstrates **cultural competency**
- Is a **flexible service** attending to what people need ("**Anything is possible**")
- Is **client centred**
- Promotes **social interaction, independence, self-awareness and confidence,**

Eligibility is assessed individually using the following criteria:

- Have a diagnosed acquired brain injury
- Aged between 16 and 65 years (although other people may be considered)

Exclusions:

People whose needs are better met in mental health or intellectual disability services.
